God wills that we know Him but we must will so as well. God wills that we find Him but we must seek.



# Sept. 27-Nov. 5.

This Fall, the **40 Days for Life** campaign is scheduled for **Sept. 27-Nov. 5.** The campaign relies on **peaceful, prayerful witness** in front of planned parenthood in Springfield. According to national organizers, more than 23,000 babies have been saved from abortion since the launch of the international campaign in 2007. Locally, organizers report at least 26 babies have been saved.

People can sign up with their parishes or as individuals to cover hours in front of the clinic. Springfield Bishop William D. Byrne also will lead people in prayer downtown during the 40 days, as he has in the past.


