Dear Friends of Blessed Trinity,

Merry Christmas!

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever!

Joyfully I greet you, your family, and all your loved ones, as we celebrate together the Nativity of the Lord! Merry and Blessed Christmas!

Today I join you in this celebration as the first pastor of our new parish of Blessed Trinity. In this our Christmas together, I am eager to rejoice with you in the Birth of the Newborn King. With special recognition, we also celebrate our new beginnings as the people of the parish, men and women, clergy and lay, young and old, longtime neighbor and newfound friends, we in this our newborn Blessed Trinity Parish.

CONFIRMATION: Typically takes place through our Religious Education program. If you are an adult and have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation, please contact the Parish Office.

HOLY ORDERS: Have you ever been inspired of a vocation to the priesthood or religious life? Please speak with Fr. Pierz or call the Parish Office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Available during pastoral visit, Sacrament of Confession, or by appointment.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: Seeking to receive all your sacraments and enter full communion with the Catholic Church? You are invited and welcome to join us! Please contact the Parish Office to learn how to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation.

Perpetual Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament takes place in the side chapel twenty-four hours a day, every day. All are welcome to come and worship and adore our Eucharistic Lord.

SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD CHRISTMAS DAY.



Mary and Joseph were tired. They had just traveled between 70 and 90 miles, depending on the route they took. This is a long way for anyone, let alone a woman nine months pregnant. Some say she would have walked rather than ridden a donkey, as is often depicted. Either way, it would have been an intensely wearying trip!

In addition to this, consider the time of year. It was winter, and the weather was cold and harsh. When Mary and Joseph at last arrived at their destination, no comfort awaited them. The inn was full and they had to take refuge in a stable.

Of course, this was not simply bad luck. Our Lord *chose* these conditions.

He chose, from the very outset of His life, what was humble and poor. He could have been born in a palace; He chose a stable instead. He could have rested in a royal crib; He preferred a manger. He could have been wrapped in the richest, warmest blankets; He chose swaddling clothes.

The words of the well-known hymn, *O Little Town of Bethlehem*, come to mind when we think of this sleeping Child, unknown but to a few, quiet and humble, God Himself among men, silent and small...

*"...in thy dark streets shineth the Everlasting Light...
the hopes and fears of all the years
are met in thee tonight."*

Truly, all the hopes and longing of God's people—chronicled throughout the Scriptures that had foretold His coming for so long—have come to rest tonight in this humble Child. *catholiccompany.com*

Memorial of St. Nicholas, Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

My name is Father Pierz. I am the new pastor of Blessed Trinity Parish, the unified parish encompassing Holy Trinity Church and Blessed Sacrament Church. I arrived here in Franklin County after several years at St. John the Evangelist Parish in Agawam. For those who may not know where Agawam is, our youth and children might know...Six Flags!

The religious education of our community, specifically our children, is a personal priority of mine. In fact, one of my first initiatives as pastor of the new Blessed Trinity Parish has been to establish a Religious Education Board to ensure that we administer an engaging religious education program that is robust and pedagogically sound.

Upon reviewing past registrations, I see you have previously enrolled your child in religious education at either the former Holy Trinity or Blessed Sacrament Parishes, but have not yet re-enrolled your child in religious education for this school year. It is my hope that this communication serves as a friendly reminder to re-enroll.

Our catechists, volunteers, and I would love to have your child join us for in-person religious education instruction! The religious education program (also known as CCD) readies students for the immediate sacramental preparation of First Communion and Confirmation. Religious education serves grades K through 9, and meets on Sunday mornings from 9:45 am to 10:45 am in the Pastoral Center on our Federal Street campus next to Blessed Sacrament Church. At that time, also in the center, we host a social hour for parents with complimentary coffee and baked goods.

BLESSED TRINITY PARISH

The timing of religious education complements the Blessed Trinity Parish Mass Schedule. The 8:00 am Mass at Holy Trinity Church on Main Street finishes around 9:00 am, allowing plenty of time to arrive by 9:45 am. Or, religious education finishes by 10:45 am, which allows time to attend the 11:00 am Mass next door at our Blessed Sacrament Church.
